Series Overview | *Kings* is a series that explores the lives of four biblical kings, David, Joash, Rehoboam, and Hezekiah, who help students discover themes of faith, wisdom, and trust in God. Students will see that they have more in common with these kings than they might imagine. From waiting on God's timing, taking ownership of our faith, seeking wise counsel, and staying humble, this series will challenge students to grow and follow God wholeheartedly in every season.

Large Group Teaching Summary | Hezekiah was lauded as one of the most righteous kings Judah ever had. However, he struggled to remain faithful to God when things were going well. We can often fall into the pattern of drawing close to God when times are hard but then forgetting or neglecting our relationship with Him when things get better. Through the life of Hezekiah, we can learn that to live consistently faithful lives, we must remember all that God has done for us through Jesus.

1. If you had three wishes from a genie right now, what would they be?

Discussion Questions

1. Read 2 Chronicles 32:24-31. What does this teach you about God? What does it teach you about yourself?
2. What things are you bargaining with God about in your life right now? What do you want Him to save you from? Do you think doing the right things will make Him do something? Why or why not?
3. What makes following God so hard when your life isn't difficult? Why do you think it's easy to believe that we can do things on our own? What makes you turn to God in the hard times?
4. Why do you think it matters what our heart's attitude is behind our actions? Why is it so important that we have the right heart? What do you think it means to have the right heart?
5. What does it mean to "humble yourself?" What makes it hard to believe that you need God's guidance and provision even in good times?
6. Why is it important for you to remember all the great things God has done for you and the love He has shown to you? What things in your life show you that God cares for you?
7. Is it hard to believe that God loves you and blesses you *freely* (He doesn't require you to do something first)? Why or why not? How does this change how you act toward God?
